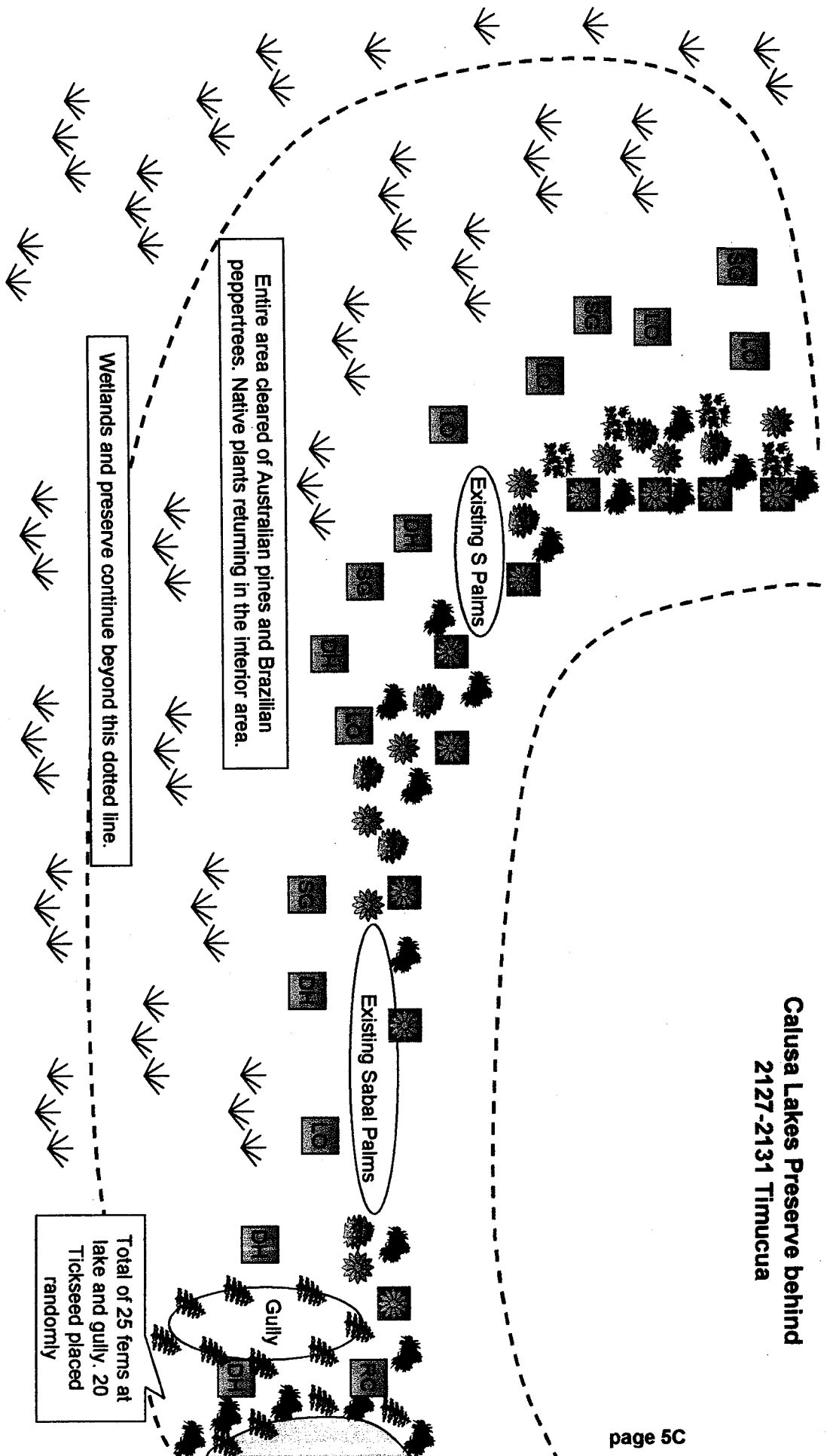

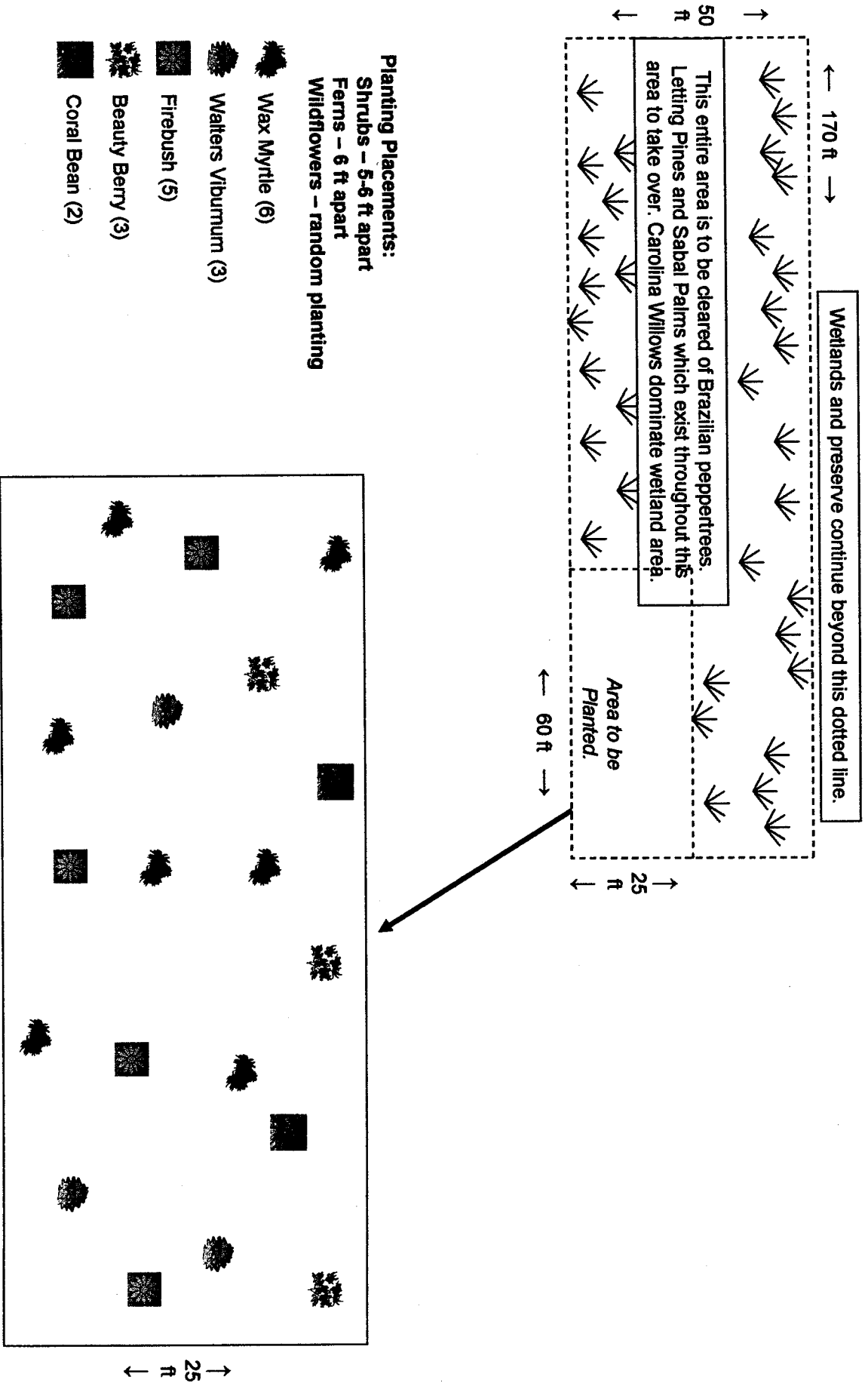

Dear Ms. Whitney:

I wanted to offer this letter of support for the next preserve landscape restoration project your community is planning to undertake. It is my understanding that you intend to continue to remove exotic and invasive species of plants, primarily Brazilian Pepper from two preserves and two lakes in the community and replant the areas using Florida native plants. The process will focus on educating and involving volunteers and homeowners in the benefits of exotic removal, and creating low maintenance zones around preserves, wetlands and ponds. As part of the Sarasota County's Neighborhood Environmental Stewardship Team (NEST) program your community is providing a positive example of how neighborhoods can take an active role in promoting the health of the natural areas and water bodies of Sarasota County. As such, your landscape restoration project is an example of the kind of activities we are suggesting communities undertake. This type of project provides three major benefits:

1. It provides a low maintenance vegetative buffer that helps filter pollutants.
  2. It will reduce the amount of exotic and invasive vegetation within the community and lessen the opportunity for these plants to migrate into other areas outside Calusa Lakes.
  3. It introduces additional native plants that may provide habitat and food value for wildlife and birds.
- This type of project also has an important educational component for the community and can act as a demonstration project for other communities to observe.

We appreciate your interest in promoting environmental stewardship (NEST) in your community and will assist wherever possible in connecting you with the resources you need to make the project a success.

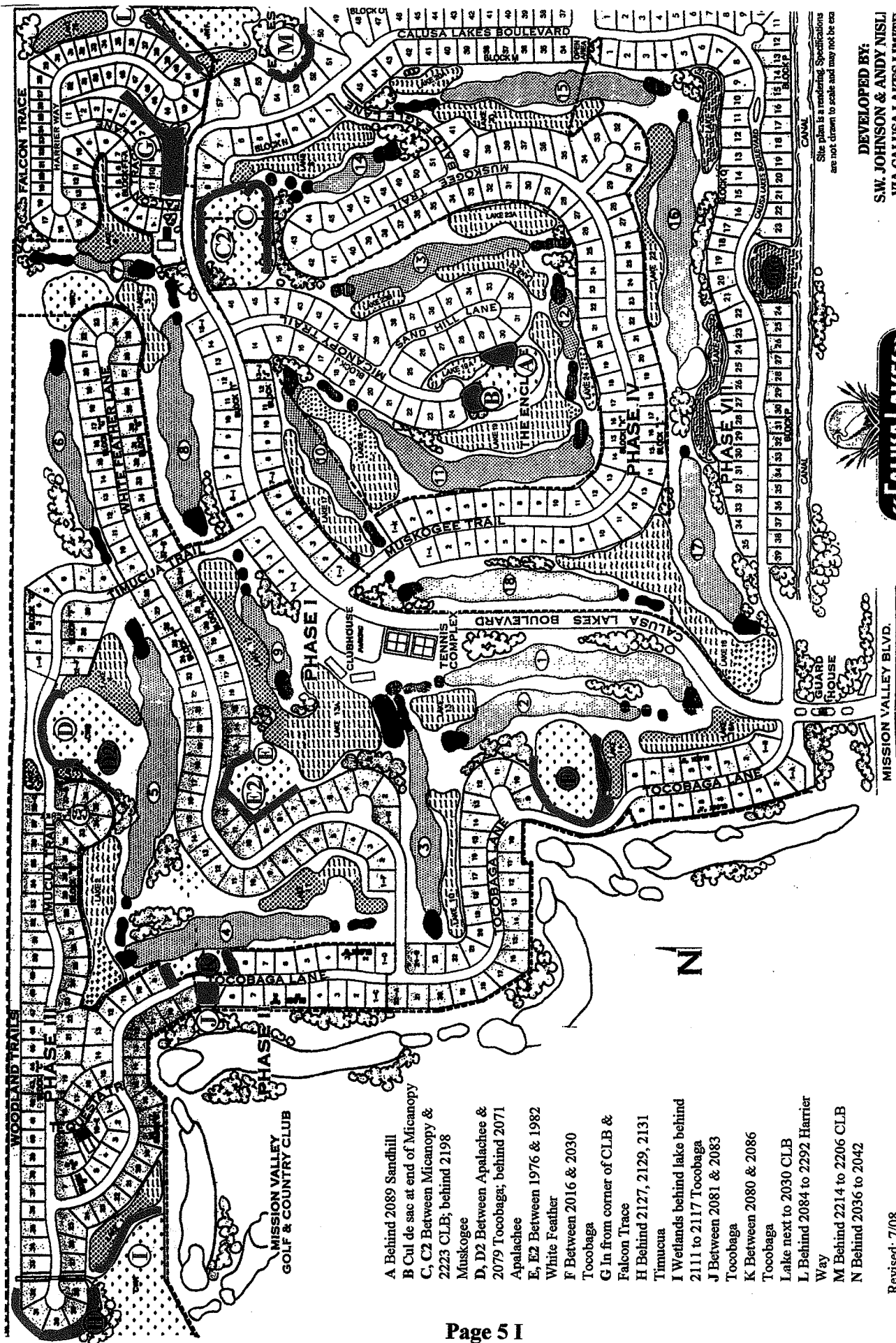

Getting rid of Brazilian pepper trees is of immense importance to the public not only in Sarasota County but throughout all of central and southern Florida. Aerial survey maps in the 2006 Brazilian Pepper Tree Management Plan found on the Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council's site ([www.fleppc.org](http://www.fleppc.org)) show their dramatic increase in density in central and southern Florida since 1995. Brazilian pepper trees are making a monoculture of much of Sarasota County. Recently, the Department of Transportation has itself shown a more proactive stance against Brazilian peppertrees by removing many miles of the invasive plants along Interstate 75.

Birds and mammals help to disperse their seeds. In removing Brazilian peppers and other invasive species from our neighborhood, there will be less opportunity for them to spread to other neighborhoods.

Replacing invasive species with native plants provides an attractive environment to the public, and shelter and food for birds and animals. Native plants conserve water by minimizing the need for irrigation. They also require less fertilizer thereby reducing environmental pollution.

Two of the preserves and one of the lakes where peppertrees will be removed and replanted with native plants can be seen from the public golf course available to all. The public can enter all the roads of the Calusa Lakes development during daytime until 7pm.



Despite declining interest rates in 2007, its notable that we made a 300% increase in interest on our reserves compared to 2005 on a 50% increase in average balances over 2005 levels. This is due to actively managing our liquidity and our investments in CDs or CDARS, while retaining full FDIC coverage.

We ask for your cooperation in completing this transition smoothly either by making the change with your bank if you use direct debit, or by using the new coupons when you get them.

### CALUSA'S GREEN THUMBS EARN SOME MORE GREEN!



The Calusa Lakes Community Association has been awarded another Sarasota County Neighborhood Grant, this time in the amount of \$24,000. It is a "matching" grant, so if we put up \$6,000 in cash and \$6,000 worth of volunteer work (that represents 500 hours,) we will receive \$12,000 from the County. The Landscape Team's plan is to use the matching money to have professionals remove the Brazilian pepper trees from the preserve near 2030/2032 Tocobaga, to be replaced by new native plants by Sweetbay Nursery. Also, pepper trees and Australian pines will be removed from the area behind 2127-2131 Timucua Trail. The rest of the money will go toward hauling away the exotic plant debris that the volunteers remove from the preserves.

In January, the Landscape Team worked at the preserve between Micanopy and 2223 Calusa Lakes Blvd., removing small pepper trees, senna, and small melaleuca trees. Participants included Gary Birkholz, Bob Ferkenhoff, Dick Puckett, Pete Price, Ron Ruff, Kevin Savage, Darryl Sjoberg, Barb and Tony Szepal, Janice and Larry Tuck, Julie Whitney, and Anne and John Worrall.

#### New Work Hours for Volunteers!

The Calusa Lakes Landscape Team of volunteers has reduced their Saturday workdays to two hours, which seems to be an optimum amount of time to work efficiently and still have energy left for other things that day. However, they need to rack up those 500 hours for the grant, so they're adding another workday each month - in addition to the second Saturday of the month, they'll meet the following Wednesday (also at 8:00 a.m.) to enable hauling the debris at the least cost. The Saturday workdays will be Feb. 9, Mar. 8, Apr. 12, May 10, and June 14. The Wednesday dates are Feb.

13, Mar. 12, Apr. 16, May 14, and June 18. ### Phase II of Mission Valley/Tocobaga Ditch Project

In early January, the second phase of the Tocobaga area adjacent to the Mission Valley Golf Course got more plantings where Brazilian pepper trees were removed last year. This project continues the cooperative efforts of our Homeowners Association and the Mission Valley Golf Club to meet the contractual obligation our developer had with Mission Valley Golf Club to maintain a visual barrier between Tocobaga and the MV golf course. New viburnum and oleanders were planted to add screening to the area in front of the ditch and around the lift station. Old vegetation was removed in front of the two electrical boxes as well. These will be screened in the future as well, further enhancing the view from the Calusa Lakes perspective.



### 2008 Landscape Renovation Priorities

Again in 2008, CLCA will be renovating several common areas in the community. The following is a list of projects that will be designed and implemented in 2008, barring any contingencies (large storms or other issues that could affect our plans.)

1. **Tocobaga/Mission Valley Ditch area phase II:** Additional screening added
2. **Front Entrance:** The bank along the west side of island 2 & 3 between and beyond (towards Tocobaga) the two driveways going into the golf maintenance shed.
3. **Tocobaga Entrance:** The area between the intersection of CLB & Tocobaga up to the first home (2001 Tocobaga) on the left.
4. **Front Entrance:** Electrical box screening near Mission Valley Blvd in left field
5. **Tocobaga cul de sac:** Near 2030 Tocobaga
6. **Phase II of White Feather:** Between 1976 & 1982
7. **CLB cul de sac:** Near 2156 CLB



Our team of landscape volunteers has worked together since 2002 to eradicate invasive plants from our preserves and wetlands, and to monitor and maintain the areas where things have been cleaned up. Each year new residents join our team as others rotate off. We seem to maintain a group of 35 team members. In the fall and spring, the landscape team volunteers get together for a potluck party. We also invite others who volunteer in community homeowner association activities.

Additionally, while we are working, passers-by have thanked us for our work. We have even given impromptu classes on native plants. In fact, we educated a group of neighbors on the difference between native and Florida friendly plants, and why we were planting only native plants in a preserve on one side of the road, while planting Florida friendly plants on the other side which was not a protected area. (Only appropriate native plants can be planted in native areas.) It should also be noted that while the new Demonstration Garden could be planted with Florida Friendly plants, the volunteers elected to plant primarily native plants.

Our newsletter has also contained articles on such things as why peppers are such a bad thing and the importance of cutting back on our lawns. An additional outcome of planting with native and Florida friendly plants is that more people in the neighborhood are expanding their gardens and reducing their lawns.

Our community is further strengthened through our neighborhood website. One of the most frequently "hit" spots is on Florida Friendly Plants and Florida Friendly/Turf Alternatives.

In the past, we have also joined together with our immediate neighbors at the Mission Valley Golf Club. In exchange for their removal of peppers lining an adjoining ditch, we hauled the debris away and provided plantings on our side of the ditch. We should mention that that "private" club has its own group of volunteers working very hard to remove Brazilian peppertrees wherever possible.
